Montessori Works Philosophy

The philosophy is based on Dr Maria Montessori's studies on human development. Children 0-6 years take in (absorb) their environment, social customs and language without effort or studying as adults do.

MISSION STATEMENT:

The Montessori prepared environment gives the child the opportunity to develop in all spheres: physical, social, spiritual using materials and activities which s/he may not find elsewhere to stimulate intellect (higher mental functioning).

VISION:

Children are interested and learn on their own initiative if the environment allows for this. The criteria are as follows:

- The materials must be child sized and easily accessible to the child
- The activities must be interesting (to the children) isolating and specific. They must be varied and gradually increasing in difficulty.
- The Educators must observe and assess the child's needs and interests and present materials accordingly.
- After the initial presentation by the Educator, the child must have time and freedom to pursue these activities when s/he chooses.
- Disruptive and disorderly behaviour is not allowed.
- Others are not to be disturbed when they are working.
- On the completion of an activity, the child is required to put the work away.
